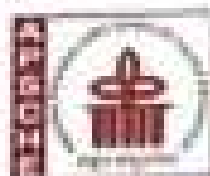

A community water system supplies water to the same population year around in many places communities lack the capacity to effectively adopt their current system for water sanitation and hygiene to the community is changing needs such as population growth, changes in water quality.

Traditional water purification methods include boiling, filtration, sedimentation and solar radiation. Water filters are not common in rural community where potable water supply coverage is very low. 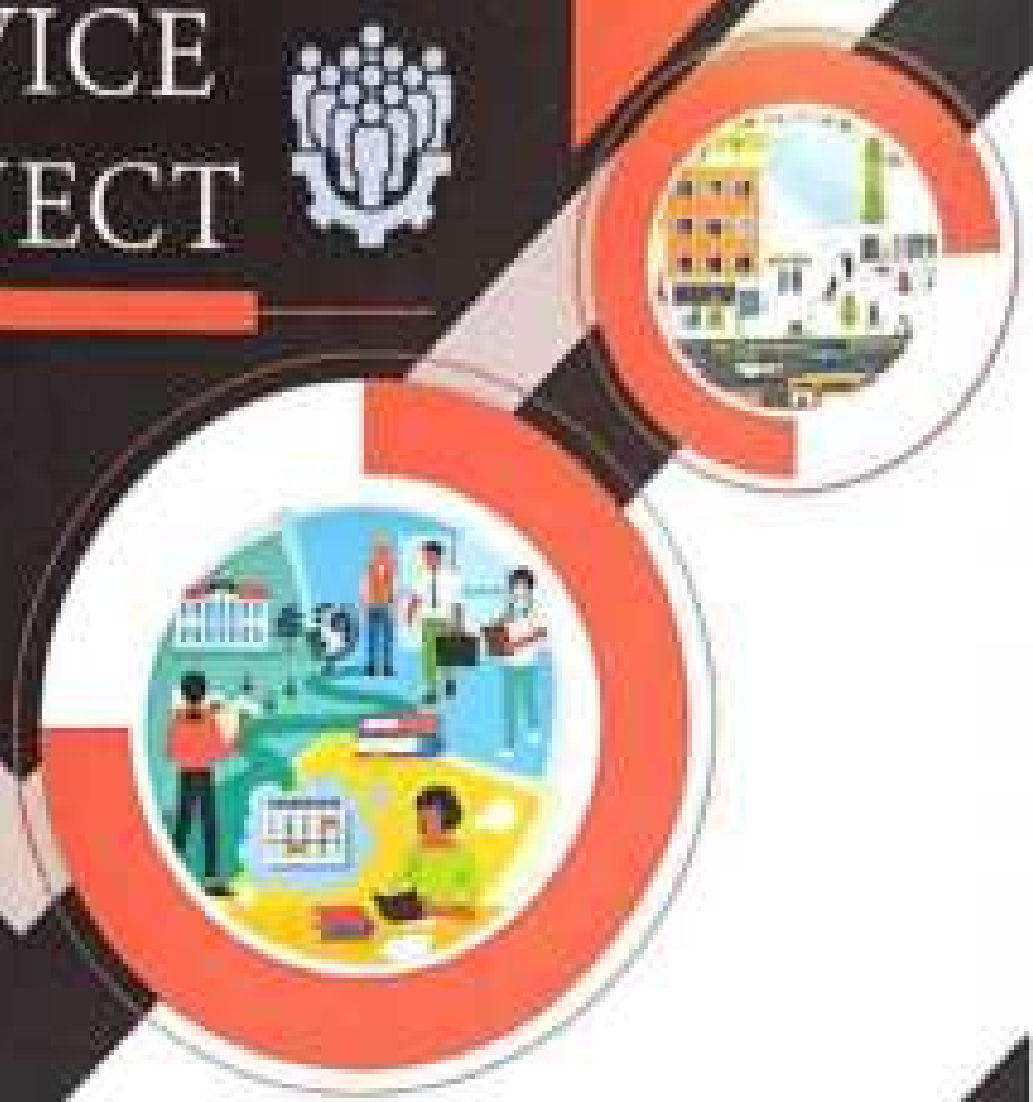



CHAPTER 2: OVERVIEW OF THE COMMUNITY

Visakhapatnam port is one of the 13th major ports in India and the only major port of Andhra Pradesh. It is a India's 5th largest state owned port by volume of cargo handled and largest on the Eastern coast. It was opened on 19th December in 1933 and was operated by Visakhapatnam port trust.

The inner harbour was built as the Bengal Nagpur railway between 1929 to 1933 to facilitate the export of manganese ore from the Coastal province. The port built at a cost of ₹ 575 lakhs and it was inaugurated by Lord Willingdon on 19th Dec

1933. During the 2nd world war, the military significance of the port increased. After Indian Independence, the port witnessed growth until the 1970s. In the last five years, the port has grown from one with 1.3 lakh tons per annum to one with 1.3 lakh tons and annual traffic
