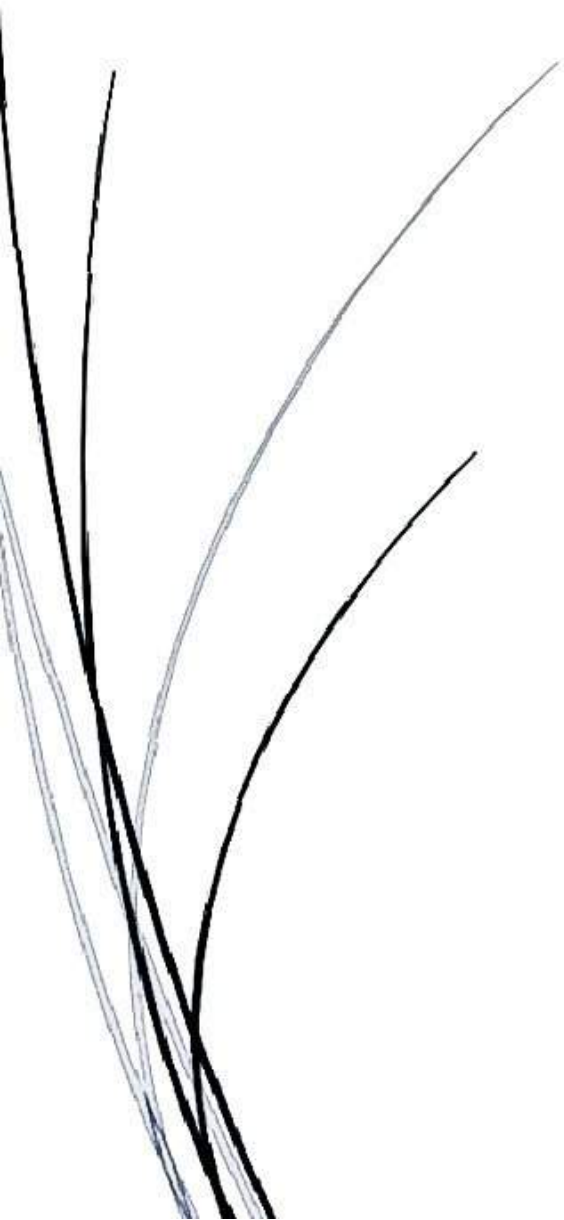

CHAPTER 1: EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The main purpose of Blood group testing is, we all should be aware of our blood groups. It plays a very important role when it comes to having a blood transfusion. Knowing our blood groups helps us to select appropriate blood for transfusion there during any emergencies or accidents.

In blood testing we should take materials, like toothpicks, Blood sample, Alcohol swabs, lancet Clean glass slide, sterile cotton because Biohazard disposal contains monoclonal antibodies (Anti-A, B and D) all type of these equipments will be readily available in a blood test tool kit. Then take a clean glass slide and draw three circles on it. ~~the~~ monoclonal antibodies (MAB) kit first take and first circle add Anti-A, to the second circle add Anti-B and the third circle add Anti-D with help of a dropper. Now wipe the ring finger with the alcohol swabs and ~~slub~~ gently heal the fingertip, when the blood sample will be collected. \square lick the ring finger ship with the lancet and wipe off the first drop of the blood. As sample gently with the help of toothpick and wait for a min to observe.
